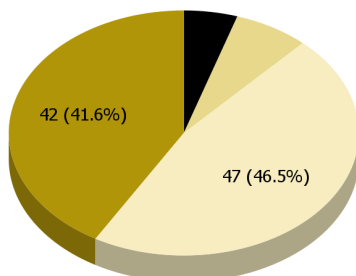
THE COMMUNITY

THE SCHOOL

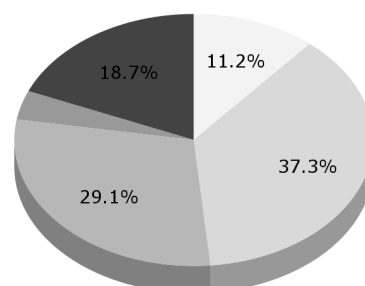
Stone Memorial High School is a comprehensive, 4-year high school with a current enrollment of 1,041 students in grades nine through twelve. U.S. News & World Report awarded Stone Memorial the Bronze Award amongst the nation's best high schools. The academic program is organized on a block schedule, where the maximum student load is 9 credits per year. Stone Memorial has a robust Career and Technical Education program that allows students to explore interests that lead to postsecondary learning and future career paths. Stone Memorial has gained accreditation from the Tennessee State Board of Education and the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. Various booster and student organizations are active on campus which provide support through voluntary efforts and fiscal contributions that help enhance instruction, student leadership and student support.

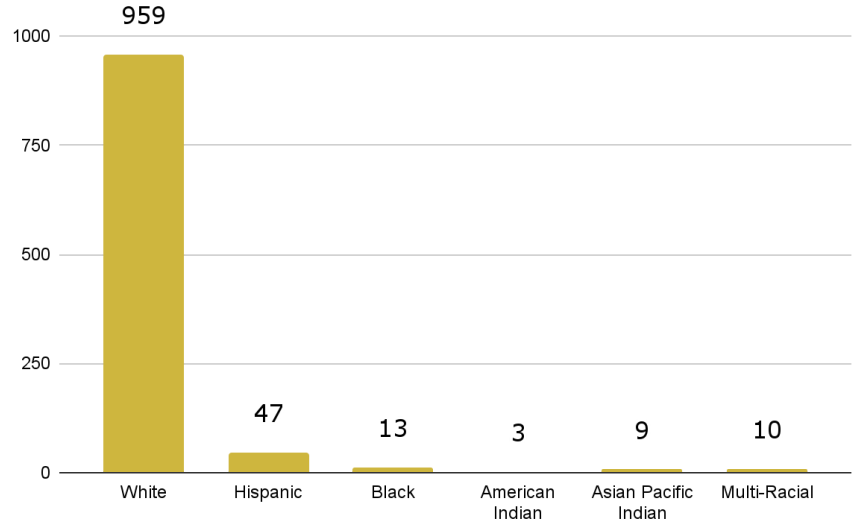
